


10 Must-Have Mobile Apps to Get the Most Out of Your Apple iPhone 7




Transfer Data with Content Transfer


Keep Files in Order with FileMaster's Help


Cozi Is One Big Family Organizer


Sync.Me Blocks Annoying Calls

Another free app, Sync.Me, is designed for those who want to block certain numbers from calling or texting. The app also includes the ability to keep contacts up to date and identify unknown phone numbers before users answer.




Google's Allo Smart Messaging App Works on iOS, Android

Anyone switching from Android to iOS might want to consider downloading Google Allo. Users also can annotate images and use the search giant's virtual personal helper Google Assistant to find information online. It's available for free.




GoToMyPC Brings Remote Desktop Support to iOS Devices


Try Out Virtual Reality with Google Cardboard

Apple's iPhone might not come with virtual reality support out of the box, but Google Cardboard aims to address that. The free app, which works with Google Cardboard headsets, allows iPhone owners to access virtual reality apps from their iPhones. Once the iPhone is inserted in a Cardboard headset and the app is turned on, users are fully immersed in virtual worlds. It's a cheap way to join in on the virtual-reality craze.




Omvana Provides Spiritual Support

Adobe's Photoshop Express Edits Photos

Anyone looking for a nicer way to edit photos in the iPhone might want to check out Adobe's Photoshop Express. The app includes the ability to edit pictures, apply filters, crop photos and much more. It doesn't have all the features one would find in standard Photoshop, but it's an ideal solution for mobile devices. Better still, it's available for free.



Keep an Eye on Your Money with Mint

Mint has long been one of the leaders in organizing a person's finances, which makes it a nice option to consider on any iPhone. The free app lets users share their bank account information and other data with the app to track their expenses, create budgets and see how well they're doing at paying off credit cards. It's a full-featured personal-budgeting app that works awfully well.
