


Tim Cook admits Vision Pro is not a mass-market Product

"We're perfectly fine with not being first," said Cook. "As it turns out, it takes a while to get it really great. It takes a lot of iteration. It takes worrying about every detail. Sometimes, it takes a little longer to do that. We would rather come out with that kind of product and that kind of contribution to people versus running to get something out first. If we can do both, that's fantastic. But if we can only do one, there's no doubt around here. If you talk to 100 people, 100 of them would tell you: It's about being the best."

Cook said Apple Intelligence makes the experience of using Apple products "profoundly different."

"I think we'll look back and it will be one of these air pockets that happened to get you on a different technology curve," said Cook.

"Apple could soon end production of Vision Pro headset"

"Apple reportedly might end production of the Vision Pro by the end of the year. That doesn't mean the mixed-reality headset is about to be discontinued, however.

Still, Cupertino apparently now has its focus on the cheaper Vision version that could launch in 2025.

While its bleeding-edge technology draws praise, the \$3,500 price remains a drawback.

"Apple has sharply scaled back production of its Vision Pro mixed reality headset since the early summer and could stop making the existing version of the device entirely by year end," reported The Information on Wednesday.

Multiple reports point to Apple now being hard at work on a more affordable version of the AR headset. To reduce the cost, the upcoming model will allegedly use a lower-resolution display, slower processor, and drop the EyeSight feature.

That might get the cost down to \$2,000, a price that Apple supposedly hopes will double demand when the product — perhaps called Vision Air — launches in 2025."

How to Hide Your Mac's Mouse Cursor

If you're watching a video on your Mac, it's nice to be completely immersed and not have notifications and other distractions. This includes your mouse cursor. I don't want to see notifications, the menu bar, or even the mouse cursor. If you put your Mac into Do Not Disturb you won't see notifications, but that won't get rid of your mouse cursor. There are couple ways to hide the mouse cursor.

- 1. Place the cursor anywhere on the video (except for the playback controls) and leave it alone and it should disappear.
- 2. When you're in full-screen mode, if you press most of the keys on your Mac it will make the cursor disappear. Just don't press any keys or it returns.
- 3. Press "Command" + "."
- 4. Download a program called "Cursorcerer." Cursorcerer is a tool that allows you to hide the Mac's cursor at any time by use of a hotkey.


1. Take a picture with your iPhone

Hearing Health

With the new updated systems (iOS 18.1, iPadOS 18.1, MacOS 15.1), Apple's Hearing Health is now available if you have the AirPods Pro 2 headphones. Apple says:


"The Hearing Aid feature has received FDA authorization. The Hearing Test and Hearing Aid features are supported on AirPods Pro 2 with the latest firmware paired with a compatible iPhone or iPad with iOS 18 or iPadOS 18 and later and are intended for people 18 years old or older. The Hearing Aid feature is also supported on a compatible Mac with macOS Sequoia and later."

Once your device is updated, under your AirPods settings you'll see a section for hearing health. Go into there and this is where you will find the option to take a hearing test.

The test takes up to about 10 minutes, and you have to do it in a very quiet room. No one can be talking or making sounds nearby. When the AirPods detect any outside sound, the test will pause. When the noise ends, you can continue.

The first thing the test does is check the seal of the ear tips to make sure you have a good fit for the size of your ears. The actual test has you tap the screen every time you hear beeping tones. It starts with the left ear and then does the right ear. You have to really concentrate because the sounds become very faint. I found that even my breathing with my AirPods in could cause me to miss a slight tone. I can't demonstrate this hear, because it would be pretty boring to watch!
